Featured Speakers



Sister Sara Butler, M.S.B.T., S.T.L., Ph.D., has specialized in ecumenical questions including women's roles in the Church. She recently published "The Catholic Priesthood and Women: A Guide to the Teaching of the Church." She belongs to the Missionary Servants of the

Most Blessed Trinity. Sister is Professor of Theology at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/ Mundelein Seminary (Archdiocese of Chicago) and has taught dogmatic theology to seminarians for over twenty years. She serves on the International Theological Commission and is a consultant to the Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization and the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Doctrine.

"Women Priests: Why Not?"

This talk will look at why this question came up and why so many Catholics still remain puzzled by the Church's answer. It will then identify the fundamental reasons for this teaching and the theological arguments to explain it. There will be time to consider answers to several of the objections that are commonly raised.

"Gender Confusion"

What is the source of the current confusion about sex and gender in our culture? How is it related to the struggle for women's rights, and "equal rights"? This talk will review the relation of gender confusion to "gender feminism," a theory that questions the value—and even the fact!—of the difference between the sexes. How does the Church evaluate these trends, and how does the "theology of the body" proposed by Pope John Paul II address them?



Fr. Brian O'Brien, originally from Houston, graduated from Boston College with a degree in Theology and Political Science. He earned a Masters in Education through the University of Notre Dame's Alliance for Catholic Education (ACE) program in 2000. He is the author of the book *Tough Choices: Bringing Moral Issues Home* (2003). He earned an M.A. in Catholic

Social Thought and Life in 2004 and a Masters of Divinity in 2007. Fr. O'Brien was ordained to the priesthood in 2007 for the diocese of Tulsa. Father has been a parish priest and high school chaplain and now serves as President of Bishop Kelley High School.

"Leave Room for the Holy Spirit! Why Ignoring the Third Person of the Trinity is Bad for Us."
